

Bishop's Palace Garden

Points of Interest



Entrance

Accessed through the Bishop's Palace Cannon Gate from Canon Lane off South Street



Point 1

Formal garden with its part Tudor wall and crenellations



Point 2

View westward from the middle gate with a choice of level and wide gravel paths with box hedging leading through the garden



Point 3

The Vista with its herbaceous beds planted in 2009. Parallel beds with warm colours towards the East becoming cooler to the West



Point 4

Rose pergola planted in 2009 carries climbing roses, clematis and honeysuckle



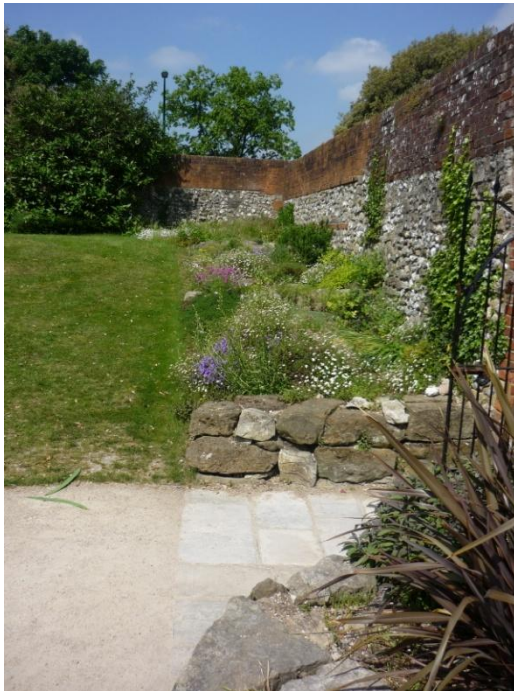
Point 5

Arboretum: About a hundred rare and unusual trees and shrubs extend over much of the garden



Point 6

Broadwalk bed: planted mainly with Mediterranean plants



Point 7

Alpine garden by western entrance from Avenue de Chartres: from here there is an upper walk along the ramparts of the City Walls



Point 8

Upper walk along the ramparts looking across the garden towards Chichester Cathedral



Point 8a

Lower walk view towards the shallow pond and seats



Point 9

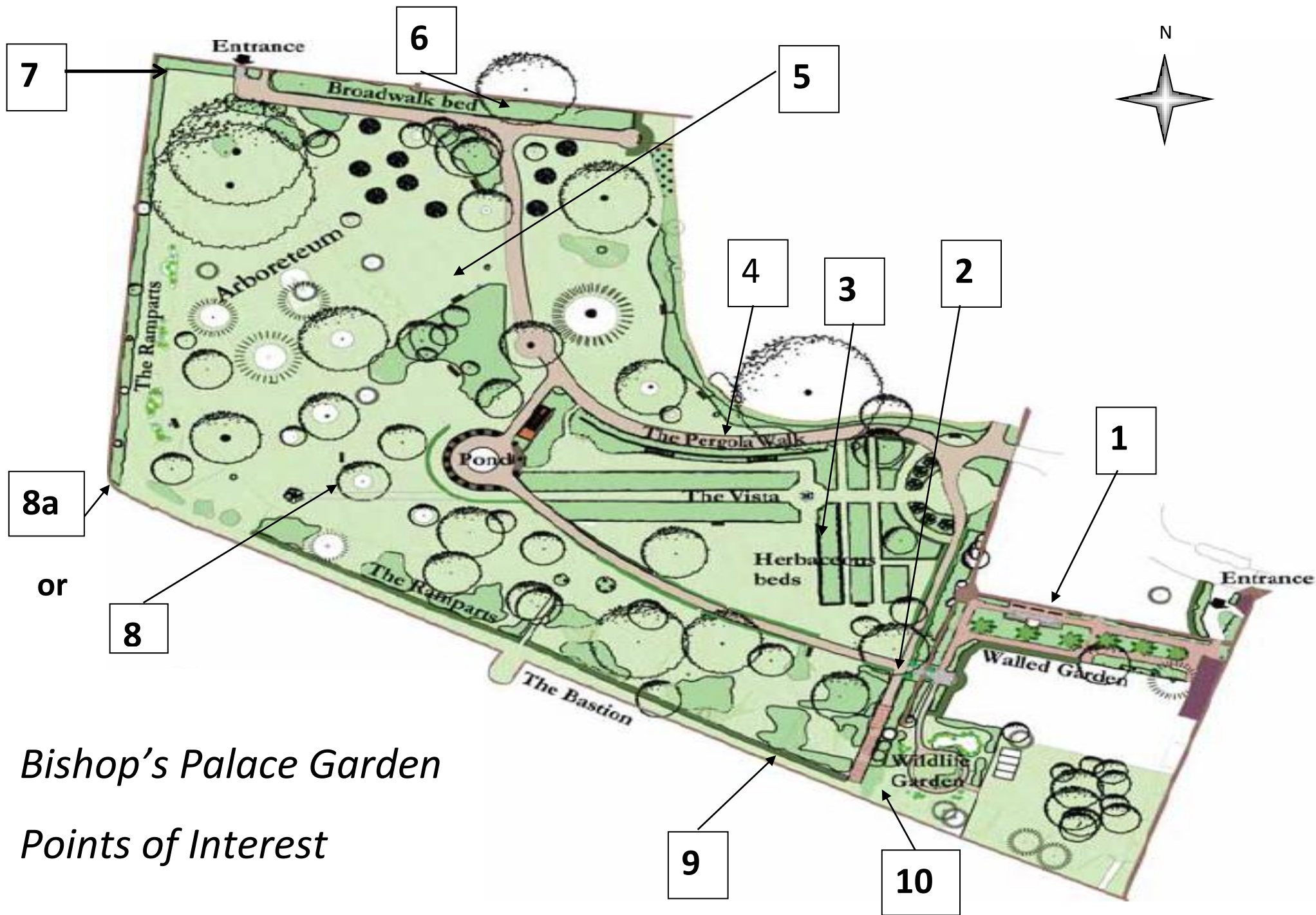
Eastern end of the southern ramparts accessed by a stepped path with handrails. Looking down through native low shrubs and trees towards the pond
