Adoption Statement

Site Allocation Development Plan Document 2014 - 2029

Notice is hereby given that Chichester District Council adopted the Site Allocation Development Plan Document 2014 – 2029 on 22 January 2019 in accordance with the above regulations.

The Site Allocation Development Plan Document (DPD) represents the second part and ‘daughter’ document to the adopted Chichester Local Plan: Key Policies 2014 – 2029. The purpose of the DPD is to deliver non-strategic residential and employment sites as set out in the Chichester Local Plan: Key Policies, and to set out guidance for the development of these sites.

The Site Allocation DPD has been subject to examination by an independent Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State. The adopted DPD incorporates modifications recommended by the Inspector as set out in the Appendix to the Inspector’s Report.

Any person who is aggrieved by the Site Allocation Development Plan Document 2014 – 2029 may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power and/or procedural requirements have not been complied with.

Any such application should be made promptly and in any event no later than the end of the six week challenge period, starting with the date on which the plan was adopted (22nd January – 5 March 2019).
