



Centurion Way


LEISURE SERIES **01**
Time : ~45 Mins

CYCLING ROUTE

Distance : 6M / 10Km

Market Cross to West Dean flat with gentle slopes

Suitable for riders of all ages and abilities and all bike types



fact

Centurion Way follows the route of a former railway which opened in 1881 and closed in 1991. The line was sold to West Sussex County Council and combined with land already owned by Chichester District Council to create a cycle path.

6 The designated cycle route ends here as you enter West Dean village.

5 The cycle route now shares a pavement with pedestrians. Give way to other users of this route

fact

The 100m diameter amphitheatre was created by Justin Marshall on the site of a former quarry.

fact

Members of "The Chichester Road Gang" by David Kemp. Made from empty oxygen gas cylinders, together they make up a ganger in a bowler hat, a gang of workers with spades and a surveyor with a theodolite. They are placed where an historic Roman road to Silchester crosses the path of the old railway line.



fact

The Roman Archway at the start of Centurion Way was designed by local artist Richard Farrington. The arch is from an ex Royal Navy minesweeper decorated with Romano British mosaics. The dancers were inspired by the Roman Palace in Fishbourne.

2 Centurion Way starts by the railway line near the entrance to Bishop Luffa School. The route from here is on a designated cycle route. Be aware of other path users.



fact

Sculptures decorate the path along the way commemorating various aspects of local history.

fact

The name, Centurion Way, was chosen due to the fact that a Roman road from Chichester to Silchester crosses its path. The name was suggested by a local schoolboy.


4 Leaving the housing estate, the path surface is clay and is a dedicated cycle route shared with pedestrians.

3 The route now passes through a housing estate on road (signposted). After 800m bear right at the green.

fact

Animal cut-outs decorate the bridge before the historic Lavant Station (now flats). These were also made by Richard Farrington. All of the animal shapes were drawn by local school children before being enlarged and reproduced in steel sheet.

1 Start at the Market Cross and follow the cycle route west on road towards Westgate. Blue cycle signs mark the route
